PLACE: TCSA High Power Range. Rattlesnake Mountain Shooting Facility, located 10 miles NW of Richland, WA. Access to the range is through the main gate on SR 225 (Horn Road) approximately 3 mi south of SR 240 and approximately 8.5 mi north of I-82 in Benton City. Facilities at the range are primitive. Lavatories are available (porta-potties) but there is no water. Please prepare accordingly.

COURSE OF FIRE: Both matches will be conducted at 300 yards.

Shooters **MUST** arrive at the match with their rifle sighted in for the match range. A suitable way to accomplish this is to sight the rifle in at 100 yards on the Rose Iris Range in advance. A shooter whose shots fall far short or far long during sighters may be disqualified at the sole discretion of the Match Director.

- The match consists of unlimited sighters, and twenty shots for record. 30 minutes total is allowed for non-convertible sighter shots and record fire.
- F-Class 300 yard (MR63-F) targets will be used for 300 yard matches.
- Targets will be scored manually. Shooters will be divided into two relays, and will provide target service for the opposite relay.

Although the intent of the series is mid-range competition, it also affords an equipment and shooter tune up opportunity before the hunting season.

RULES:

- There is a MANDATORY safety briefing for all shooters. The safety briefing is normally held 15 minutes prior to the scheduled start of shooting. Please plan to arrive at the range 30 minutes or more before the scheduled start of shooting to be registered, pay fees, be assigned a target number and relay, and attend the MANDATORY safety briefing.
- The match program may be shot from the prone position, seated, kneeling, or from a bench the shooter provides.
- Slings, front rests, bipods, or sand bag front supports may be used. Bipods must be attached to the rifle. External commercial or homemade rests other than bipods are allowed. Rear support bags may be used, but the rifle MUST be shoulder fired.
- Hearing and eye protection is required.

EMPTY CHAMBER INDICATOR (ECI):

- An Empty Chamber Indicator is required to be in your rifle at all times except during the preparation period and the firing of your relay.
- An Empty Chamber Indicator should be in your rifle when you arrive at the range to check in.
 - If you do not have an Empty Chamber indicator, arrive at the range with your rifle unloaded and the action open. Let the Match Director know you do not have an Empty Chamber Indicator BEFORE handling your firearm, and one will be provided.

HANDLING OF FIREARMS: Handling firearms behind the firing line is not permitted without Match Director authorization.

FIREARMS: Any safe center fire rifle. Rifles may be single shot, bolt action, or semiautomatic. Automatic rifles are not permitted. Muzzle brakes are allowed. Ammunition may be commercial manufactured or hand loaded safe ammunition and will be provided by the competitor. Tracer, incendiary or armor piercing ammunition is prohibited. Any sighting system is permitted, iron sights or telescopic sights. Spotting scopes are permitted.

MATCH FEES: Adults \$10.00 TCSA club matches, juniors shoot free. No cash prizes will be awarded.
